The AAKF North Central Region welcomes you to the AAKF 61st National Championships and International Camp to be held in Bloomington, Minnesota from June 19 - 22, 2024.

Join us for this longstanding competition to uphold the *budo* spirit and the high standards of traditional karate through top caliber competition. The event will feature six individual and five team competition categories alongside the ever-thriving Junior National and Adult Kyu Championships.

Camp participation is open to all karateka and all ranks are invited to attend. If you are not a member of the AAKF, you will be charged an additional \$40.

All Adult and youth kyu competitors must 1) belong to a registered AAKF club, 2) be a member of the AAKF, and 3) have their rank registered with the AAKF. In addition, all black belt competitors (adult and youth) must have their rank registered with the WTKF. Contact your Regional Director for an application. The cost is \$150 for both organizations, or \$100 if your Dan rank has already been registered with the AAKF. Please have all membership and registration requirements completed <u>before</u> submitting competition paperwork to the Regional Director.

## International Camp and Judges Seminar Technical Qualifications and Tournament Participation

The AAKF National Championships will be preceded by a 3-day International Camp conducted in conjunction with the Judges' seminar. The International camp will emphasize Traditional Budo Principles, Fundamentals and Applications.

As in all AAKF camps, training is designed to improve the technical understanding of karatekas of all ranks and ages, for competing and non-competing athletes and cover all aspects of training (*kata*, *kumite*, *kogo*, *enbu*).

There will be exams conducted for dan rank, judge's qualifications, ranking examiner, and coaching qualification on Friday June 21, 2024.

All examinees are required to take part in all three days of training.

#### **Competition Events - Adult Black Belt Nationals**

Ages 18 through 54 for Fukugo, Kumite and Team Kumite No upper age limit for Kata, Team Kata and Enbu

The competition events for the AAKF Adult National Championships are below:

Competition Event	Description
Men's Individual Kata	Demonstration of Traditional Karate Kata.
Women's Individual Kata	Demonstration of Traditional Karate Kata.
Men's Synchronized Kata	Three men perform a Kata together. In the final match, the athletes demonstrate the application of the techniques in the Kata and Bunkai.
Women's Synchronized Kata	Three women perform a Kata together. In the final match, athletes demonstrate the application of the techniques in the Kata and Bunkai.
Man/Woman Enbu	A man/woman pair of athletes perform choreographed offense/defense techniques.
Man/Man Enbu	A man/man pair of athletes perform choreographed offense/defense techniques.
Men's Fuku-go	A synthesis of Kumite and Ki-tei Kata – matches alternate between Kumite and Kata.
Women's Fuku-go	A synthesis of Kogo Kumite and Ki-tei Kata – matches alternate between Kogo and Kata.
Men's Individual Kumite	A match between two men employing free sparring without contact.
Women's Individual Kumite	A match between two women employing free sparring without contact.
Men's Team Kumite	Kumite between two, 3-man teams. The winning team is that with the highest total score.

### **Competition Events - Adult Kyu Nationals**

The Adult Kyu competition is a combined kata and kumite event. Kata and kumite requirements for each division are the same as the AAKF Youth Nationals Rules. Divisions may be combined as necessary based on the number of entries. In a combined division, participants will perform the kata associated with their division. The kumite exchanges will be based on the participant in the lowest division.

Ages: Youth - Ages 6 through 17; Adult - 18 and up

Ranks: Youth - 8th Kyu and above; Adult 8th Kyu - 1st Kyu

#### Youth & Adult Kyu INDIVIDUAL events:

Competition Event	Description
Class Elite Black Belt (youth only)	Kata: Bassai Dai   Kanku Dai   Jion   Empi (pick one) Kumite: Kogo (points/penalties per WTKF Rules; no OT)
Class A 1st and 2nd Kyu	Kata: Bassai Dai   Kanku Dai   Jion   Empi (pick one) Kumite: Kogo (points/penalties per WTKF Rules; no OT)
Class B 3rd and 4th Kyu	Kata: Tekki Shodan Kumite: 4 exchanges (2 each); designated attacker; aka and shiro take turns for tsuki and keri attacks.
Class C 5th and 6th Kyu	Kata: Heian Yondan Kumite: 3 exchanges; either side initiates, Chudan only; gyaku-zuki vs uke-waza and gyaku-zuki; no kicks.
Class D 7th and 8th Kyu	Kata: Heian Nidan Kumite: 4 exchanges (2 each); Ippon kumite, jodan and chudan tsuki.

**Note:** Classes may be combined depending on number of participants at Tournament Organizer's (TO) sole discretion. In case of combining, kata & kumite requirement will be adjusted to lower level class per TO sole discretion.

#### Youth & Adult Kyu TEAM events:

Competition Event	Description
Synchronized Kata	Three athletes (same or mixed gender) perform a Kata together. There is no bunkai requirement.
Enbu	A pair of athletes (same or different genders) perform choreographed offense/defense techniques.

There is no specific age or rank requirement for Synchronized Kata or Enbu team members. The teams may include members of various ages, ranks and genders. However, youth and Adult Kyu competitors may not combine to form teams.

**Note**: The requirements for the Youth Nationals **in general** are a rank of 8th Kyu or above and between the ages of 6 and 17 years. Please refer to the link on page 7 for the full description of the AAKF Youth Competition Rules.

#### **National Adult Black Belt Competitor Requirements**

- Each Participant must be a registered 2024 AAKF individual member and belong to a club that is a 2024 AAKF registered member.
- Each Adult National participant must have a Black Belt ranking.
- Each Adult National participant must have their rank registered with the AAKF and the WTKF.
- Each Adult National Competitor must be 18 years of age or older.
- Each Adult National Competitor participating in Kumite or Fuku-go must be between 18 and 54 years of age.

#### Youth & Adult Kyu Competitor Requirements

- Each Participant must be a registered 2024 AAKF individual member and belong to a club that is a 2024 AAKF registered member.
- Each Kyu Participant must have their Kyu rank registered with the AAKF. All youth black belt participants must have their rank registered with the AAKF and the WTKF.
- Each Youth National participant must be between 6 and 17 years of age and hold a rank of 8th Kyu or above.
- Each Adult Kyu National participant must be 18 years of age or older and hold a rank of 8th Kyu - 1st Kyu.

#### Waiver and Release of Liability

In consideration of being permitted to participate in the activities conducted by American Amateur Karate Federation (AAKF) and affiliated clubs, North Central Region (NCR) hosted by AAKF North Central Region (NCR), Sanctioned by the American Amateur Karate Federation (AAKF), and conducted on property owned by Cedar Valley Church in Bloomington, Minnesota, I hereby agree as follows on behalf of myself, my personal representatives, heirs, beneficiaries and assigns.

I ACKNOWLEDGE AND AGREE that I have voluntarily applied to AAKF, NCR & Cedar Velley Church to participate in Karate practice and competition; these activities are physically strenuous, dynamic, and challenging application of self-defense which includes, but is not limited to, punching, kicking, striking and grappling, both individually and with partners. I further understand that such activity includes inherent dangers including serious bodily injury, permanent disability, paralysis or death which may be caused from my actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others or the conditions of the facility in which the activity is conducted and I understand and appreciate the nature of such hazards and risks. I also understand there may be other risks or other social or economic losses either not known to me or readily foreseeable at this time; and I FULLY ACCEPT ALL SUCH RISKS AND ALL RESPONSIBILITY FOR LOSSES, COSTS, AND DAMAGES incurred as a result of my participation in the activity. I have consulted with my physician prior to engaging in the practice of Karate with AAKF, NCR & Cedar Valley Church and am qualified, in good health and proper physical condition to participate in such activity. I am responsible for monitoring my own activity level and maintaining awareness of my own physical limitations. I further agree that I will immediately discontinue participation in any activity which I perceive to be unsafe for any reason.

Limited first aid by qualified medical personnel is available on site. However, the AAKF, NCR & Cedar Valley Church have not set aside funds for athletes who suffer from incidental injuries requiring further medical attention and/or hospitalization. I WILL BE REQUIRED TO PROVIDE PROOF OF CURRENT MEDICAL INSURANCE FOR THE DURATION OF PARTICIPATION, AND BE PERSONALLY RESPONSIBLE FOR OUT OF POCKET MEDICAL EXPENSES RESULTING FROM SUCH INJURIES.

I HEREBY RELEASE, DISCHARGE, COVENANT NOT TO SUE AND AGREE TO RELEASE and HOLD HARMLESS AAKF, NCR, and Cedar Valley Church, their administrators, members, governing board, directors, agents, officers, volunteers, employees and other participants, owners and lessors of the premises on which the activity takes place (each considered a "Releasee" and collectively referred to as "Releasees") from all liability, claims, demands, losses or damages on account caused or alleged in whole or in part by any act or omission of the Releasees in connection with the activities described above, whether or not caused in whole or in part by the negligence of any Releasee, including rescue operations, and further agree that if, despite this release, I or anyone on my behalf makes a claim against any Releasee, I will indemnify, save and hold harmless each of the Releasees from any litigation expenses, attorney's fees, loss liability, damage or cost as may occur as the result of such claim.

I agree to abide by all rules and regulations of the AAKF, NCR and Cedar Valley Church, and to exercise caution and restraint when practicing Karate individually and when taking part in the AAKF National Championship. I agree to immediately report any unsafe conditions which come to my attention, including but not limited to the floor or any equipment. Any intentional act to injure another participant is expressly prohibited. AAKF, NCR & Cedar Valley Church reserve the right to dismiss any participant at any time for any reason.

#### **General Rules and Regulations for Athletes and Coaches**

Martial art has a long history of using "Shi-ai" (testing each other) as a guide for future development and not for the purpose of winning only. Therefore, all karate athletes should keep in mind the highest ideals of Traditional Karate during competition.

#### **Procedure for a Protest**

- All protests must go through a competitor's coach to the chief judge (in the case of Kata, Enbu and Ki-tei) or
  to the respective court's Kan-sa (in the case of Kumite and Ko-Go). The protest can be only on the basis of
  operational violation of the competition rules.
- 2. Competitors or coaches are not allowed to protest any technical, scoring and/or medical decisions as long as those decisions are based on competition rules.
- 3. The coach's protest must be reported prior to either competitor leaving the court during the contested match.
- 4. The coach's protest explanation shall not exceed five (5) minutes.
- 5. Once a decision has been reached on a specific protest, that decision shall be final. No further protest or appeals shall be tolerated. In the case where a coach or athlete persists in contesting the final decision, the Kan-sa shall have the authority to eject that coach or athlete from the competition area.
- 6. Any disrespect toward officials and judges by competitors or coaches during or after a match will not be tolerated and may serve as a cause for disqualification from the competition. It may also serve as a cause for ejection from the competition area.
- 7. If a protest has merit, then court judges will call a meeting and correct the violation. If a violation cannot be corrected, then the result is void and the match must be repeated.
- 8. In the case where court judges are unable to render a decision or in the case where a competition controversy is of a technical nature, the decision of the jury shall be final. A jury at a competition is comprised of the chief judge, assistant chief judge and three (3) other pre-designated judges.
  - Each member of the jury has one (1) vote and the decision will be based on majority. In the case of a tie, the chief judge will make the final decision.
- If, after a competition match, a violation of rules is discovered and confirmed by the jury, the decisions
  of the competition shall become void and all records of that competition match shall be expunged,
  unless the violation can be corrected.
- 10. In the case where a question arises or a controversy exists that is not covered by the competition rules, the decision of the jury shall be final.
- 11. At the completion of the championship, no protest in any shape or form will be granted. The decisions and records of the championship will be final and cannot be altered or changed in any shape or form.
